Graduation Rates are calculated by taking the number of starts minus withdrawals/terminations divided by total starts (excluding students unavailable for graduation due to death, incarceration, active military service, or the onset of a medical condition that prevents continued enrollment.)

Employment Rates are calculated by taking the number of graduates employed in the field of study divided by the total number of graduates (excluding graduates unavailable for employment due to further education, death, incarceration, active military service, or the onset of a medical condition that prevents employment.)

Retention Rates are calculated by taking the numerator = number of retained students still in the program divided by the denominator = total number of students who started school during the reporting period, minus those who transferred out to another program, plus those who transferred in. (Exclude from the calculation the following categories: death, incarceration, active military service deployment, or the onset of a medical condition that prevents continued enrollment.)
